A Snapshot: Alabama MRC Unit Activities

- In response to tornadoes, the **PROJECT H.E.L.P. USA MRC (Birmingham, AL)** provided a variety of medical services, including triage, first aid, and verification and replacement of medication. The **Black Belt MRC - Macon and Bullock County (Tuskegee, AL)** also responded, assisting the county sheriff's office and local emergency management agencies with debris cleanup.
- Autauga/Prattville MRC (Prattville, AL)** volunteers participated in medical countermeasure training, including points of dispensing planning and response. This training helps the MRC prepare to respond to a pandemic or other incident requiring mass dispensing.
- The **PROJECT H.E.L.P. USA MRC (Birmingham, AL)** and **Twenty First Century Youth MRC (Birmingham, AL)** taught Stop the Bleed to community members. Stop the Bleed training teaches people life-saving skills that can be used to limit blood loss in an emergency.
- The **Calhoun-Cleburne MRC (Jacksonville, AL)** and **Baldwin County MRC (Robertsdale, AL)** provided first aid at community events.
- The **Dallas County MRC (Selma, AL)** operated its "Doc in a Bus" program and MRC volunteers contributed their time to administer free healthcare services for low-income and underserved populations.
