

FY19 State Highlights: Colorado



A Snapshot: Colorado MRC Unit Activities

- **Pueblo MRC (Pueblo, CO)** volunteers assisted with monthly hepatitis A vaccination clinics in response to local outbreaks. The clinics were focused on vaccinating at-risk populations and were held at a number of community outreach sites.
- The **Colorado Radiation Response Volunteer MRC (Denver, CO)** and **Colorado Veterinary MRC (Denver, CO)** participated in a radiation response exercise with local hospital staff. Volunteers exercised the use of equipment to locate radioactive sources, communication of contamination information with hospital personnel, and decontamination procedures.
- **MRC of Boulder County (Boulder, CO)** volunteers participated in training focused on a task force that assesses access and functional needs (AFN) during emergency response. The AFN task force responds when an evacuation is ordered in Boulder County (e.g., wildfires, flooding) and evaluates access and functional needs of residents prior to relocation to a shelter or alternative placement.
- **Multiple MRC units in Colorado** participated in flu vaccination clinics. These vaccination activities enable MRC units to exercise their capabilities to respond to a pandemic or other incident requiring mass dispensing.
