FY19 State Highlights: North Carolina



A Snapshot: North Carolina MRC Unit Activities

- Prior to Hurricane Dorian, the **Mountain Regional MRC (Flat Rock, NC)** engaged in local and state planning and assisted with resource readiness. In response to the storm, medical volunteers with the **Metrolina MRC (Charlotte, NC)** deployed to a shelter for several days in Durham, NC. In addition, the **Capital MRC (Raleigh, NC)** set up and provided medical care at shelters, including a shelter established for displaced nursing home and home health individuals. Volunteers with the **NC Baptist Men MRC Central Region (Cary, NC)** also responded to Hurricane Dorian, assisting with disaster relief stations and providing first aid.
- Due to a mumps outbreak at a local university, **Alamance County MRC (Burlington, NC)** operated a measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR) vaccination clinic to help stop the spread of the disease.
- In response to a water utility disruption at a medical center, the **MidCarolina SMAT MRC (Chapel Hill, NC)** provided the center with numerous water-handling appliances (for example, hand washing stations, a bathroom trailer, and water purifying units).
- The **Mountain Regional MRC (Flat Rock, NC)** provided technical support and medical assets to healthcare facilities impacted by a severe snowstorm.
