Monthly at a Glance



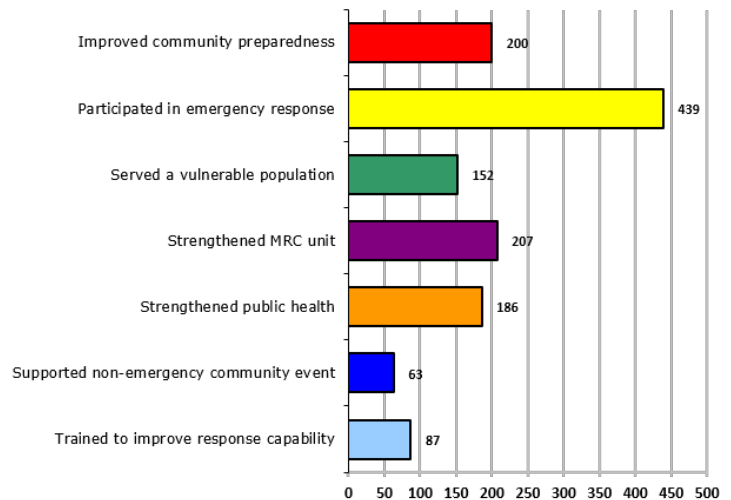
829 MRC units
